#### **Dear Parents and Carers**



## **Foundation**

Foundation have been enjoying two stories about plants - The Tiny Seed and The Curious Gardener. They have been enjoying finding out about different seeds and what they need to grow. We wondered, do the biggest seeds grow into the biggest plants? Have a look at our seed collection and see what you think...

## Year 1

Year 1 went on a welly walk around Poundbury looking at the different buildings and landmarks. There are loads of similarities with London that include Strathmore House based on Buckingham Palace, Royal Pavilion Arch taken from Marble Arch. We ended our Welly Walk with a trip to Poundbury Garden Centre to take part in a mural of a tree. The children used their hand prints to decorate the tree with leaves. The tree will be put up inside the garden centre near the exit.



## Year 2

This term we have loved learning all about the importance of bees! We have enjoyed a visit from a local beekeeper, explored our school grounds to identify which areas we could make more bee-friendly and created some beautiful drawings of bees.







We have been learning about plants and adaptation in our science sessions. Each class is growing broad beans under different conditions and monitoring the growth each week. We also have a Venus fly trap in each classroom and have enjoyed learning about how they work. We are now waiting patiently for them to catch their dinner!

## Year 3

This half term, year 3 had a visit from the Weymouth and West Dorset beach lifeguards from the RNLI. We learnt some important tips to help us stay safe if we visit the beach including what the different flags mean that the lifeguards can use. They also shared some great safety advice to help us remember:

- 1. Stop and think- is it a safe place to swim? Can you see the lifeguard and the flags?
- 2. Stay together- always stay close to our friends and family.
- 3. FLOAT- if you get into trouble or feel tired in the water, FLOAT like a starfish until you feel calm.
- 4. Call 999- ask for the coastguard if you see someone who needs help.



## Year 4

Year 4 have been lucky enough to have expert music tuition from a samba teacher this term. Samba is a Brazilian rhythm which we have been playing on lots of different types of drums and other percussion instruments, including Agogo bells, Surdo drums and Ganzas. We have really enjoyed trying out the different instruments and practising different rhythms. We will be creating our own rhythms and playing different layers in the music to create a fabulous Samba rhythm!

## **Base News**


We have been enjoying stories all about the ocean this half term. We have been investigating our question 'What wondrous creatures live under the sea?'.

We will be writing our own sea adventures at the end this term.






# Songs of the Term

#### **I Belong**

Swifts, swallows and house martins have migrated all the way from Africa to spend the summer in our country. Over our school, The Great Field and the rooftops of Poundbury there are lots of these birds swooping around catching insects to feed their chicks but they all look very similar! Can you be a super spotter and see if you can identify them? Let us know at superspotters@damers.dorset.sch.uk

#### Swift



- Dark, sooty brown, swifts may appear black against the sky as they swoop and glide
- · Wide, crescent-shaped wings.
- · Short forked tail.
- Body to 16cm long.
- Wingspan 40cm.
- Often spotted flying very high in the sky.

#### **Swallow**




- Swallows are glossy, dark blue-black on top with a white underside and a red throat.
- Scythe-shaped wings with smaller wingspan than swift.
- Long, forked tail.
- Body 15 to 20cm long.
- Wingspan 32cm.
- Often spotted flying low to the ground or at tree height in darting and gliding motions or perching on telegraph wires and aerials.
- Swallows tend to make their presence known by tweeting and chirruping.

#### **House Martin**



- House martins have a blue/black back, head and wings.
- White underside and rump.
- Small forked tail.
- Body 13cm long.
- Wingspan 26cm to 29cm (smaller than swifts and swallows).



Finally that **time** has arrived and the sun is shining and the evenings are becoming lighter. Now is a perfect time to help your child learn about time. Why not:

- Make a clock out of natural resources.
- · Have a go at making a sundial.
- Look at the 12 and 24hr clock.
- Go on a clock hunt. How many different clocks can you see?
- Time yourself completing a task eg. brushing your teeth
- Look at a calendar and plan some fun activities.
- Learn to tell the time





#### RE themes

- Year 1 will be finding out about Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur and asking why It is important to Jewish children.
- Year 2 will be investigating Haj and asking does completing Haj make a person a better Muslim
- **Year 3** will be looking at Hinduism and the pilgrimage to the River Ganges
- Year 4 will be studying prayer and worship in the Christian church. Do people need to go to Church to show they are Christians?

Jigsaw PSHE for next half term will be "Changing me."

He also came up with some ideas to help reduce the amount of cars parking around the school when dropping off and picking up. The Eco Crew are looking into this with Sustrans. Matthew has promised to get back to the children before the end of term on their points.

A massive thank you to Holly for running the free Bikeability sessions to our Year 4 children, allowing them to gain more skills and confidence when out cycling.




#### Football Tournament

What WE will do: ☐ Check your child's attendance every day. ☐ Phone home to discuss your child's attendance with you. ☐ Invite you into school for attendance meetings if we are concerned. ☐ If we cannot establish a reason for absence, then we may make a welfare home visit to see if we can help.

We have seen more requests for term time holiday recently. We do appreciate that it is often much more affordable to book holidays during the term a time when budgets are tight. I would however like to remind all parents and carers of the disruptive effect time off school can have on children, sometimes missing out on whole units of work that aren't revisited or simply missing out on friendships and other important experiences.
